Staffing Changes:

- We will add an Associate Pastor, Andrew Frerichs, to our ministry team.
- We will add three new Child Development Center teachers to our team.
- Middle School History and Technology teacher,
 Mr. Lanier, has accepted a position at a different school.
 This position, God willing, will be filled by a great teacher in Mrs. Allison Moldenhauer.

Room Changes:

- 7th Grade classroom moves to the advanced math classroom.

- 2nd Grade classroom moves to the former 4th grade classroom

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

Do You Have Running Water?

Water... Rivers ebb and flow, babbling brooks, raging rivers, thunderous waves. Water is needed to sustain life. Our body is made up of approximately 60% water, but some organs require more than others. For example, blood is 83% water, as it flows through all organs and carries oxygen and nutrients. The brain, heart, and lungs are 75 -79% water. All living things on Earth need water to survive, from tiny cyanobacteria to giant blue whales. Without enough water, we die.

Emotions can be like a river, from waves that overcome us and bring us to tears, to the still waters that bring peace. Water flows within us to sustain us. We have the Holy Spirit, the presence of Christ, in us to help calm our emotional seas; to cleanse us, refresh us, and renew us.

As Jesus told the woman at the well in John 4:13-14, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." In John 7:37–38, Jesus tells us, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'" In Revelation 7:17 we are reminded, "For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Praise God for the running, living waters of the Holy Spirit to sustain us.

How are the "running waters" in your life? The Holy Spirit is working in all of us. However, sometimes the waters are rough in times of sickness, betrayal, death, or hardships of life.

Rocket City Scholarships 2024-2025 Deadline Approaching

This year 15 students received \$95,000.00 from Rocket City Scholarships to attend Grace Lutheran School. This is possible due to friends and family of Grace allocating a portion of their Alabama tax dollars to Rocket City Scholarships. The Alabama Accountability Act allows for taxpayers to designate their tax dollars to be used by Scholarship Granting Organizations (SGO). Donations to a certified SGO count as taxes paid on your Alabama State Income Tax. The Alabama Accountability Act allows for 100% of an Alabama taxpayer's state tax liability to be used to support SGOs. The deadline for making donations to be used for the 2024-2025 school year is June 30th.
