

Master Planning Report

Progress Update

December 2023 – Grace Lutheran finalized the purchase of the 3.07 acre plot on the north side of our campus.

January – April 2024 – Grace Lutheran Board of Directors (BOD) went through an architect selection process. The BOD identified and interviewed a total of four different architecture firms, and ultimately selected Fuqua & Partners Architects to assist our congregation in developing a Master Facility Plan to meet the needs of our growing ministry.

May 2024 – The BOD established a Master Plan Committee to work with Fuqua & Partners Architects. Serving on that committee are Jack Hengel, Stephen Wank, Kenny Ols, Jessica McGuire, Christina Sasso, Jeff Sanders, Tony Luchner, and Pastor Russ.

June – August 2024 – The Master Plan Committee met with Fuqua & Partners and shared the challenges that our current facilities present as well as ministry opportunities that we see on the horizon. The committee has received concept sketches of a possible Master Plan and is working with Fuqua & Partners to consider additional concepts.

Goals and Communication Plan

September - October 2024 – Good planning takes time. While the committee has already had the opportunity to see and consider some concepts for the Master Plan, they are working hard to be thorough in their approach and consider the full range of possibilities. During September and October, the Master Plan Committee will continue to work with Fuqua & Partners in developing and considering Master Plan concepts.

November 2024 – During the month of November, the Master Plan Committee is hoping to be far enough in the process to host a couple of Town Hall Presentation Meetings. At these meetings, the committee will share the identified needs of our ministry as well as Master Plan design possibilities that could meet those needs. The committee will further share what they identify as the benefits and limitations of the potential designs, and gather feedback from the congregation.

January 2025 – The Master Plan Committee hopes to be able to bring a recommendation to the members of Grace Lutheran at our 2nd Quarter Voters’ Assembly Meeting to adopt a Master Plan that will serve our ministry well as we seek to share the Gospel of Jesus through our Child Development Center, School, and Congregational Ministries for years to come. While this is a target and goal, we recognize that feedback and input from the congregation may lead us in a different direction that will require additional time to pursue.

Man’s Plans and God’s Purposes

Proverbs 19:21 is always helpful - *“Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the LORD that will stand.”* This is an ambitious timeline, and the goals of the Master Plan are ambitious goals. There are many variables that could prevent this timeline from being realized, and many obstacles that could slow or prevent the achievement of the goals. In all of this, we celebrate and give thanks that the purpose of the LORD will stand. Trusting that the purpose of the LORD will stand takes pressure and worry off of all of us. Knowing that the LORD’s purposes will stand allows us to work with fervor while not stressing about the outcome. The will of God is always done. We pray for His guidance, we listen to the Spirit, and we proclaim the Gospel of Jesus in the best way that we can.

Jesus Takes Dubs

Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

-1 Corinthians 15:58

One of the phrases I've adopted into my vocabulary is, "Jesus takes dubs." I have absolutely zero idea where I picked the phrase up, but by the time I was on vicarage, I found myself saying it all the time. Is it a little bit silly? Yes. But do I believe it tells us something very true about Jesus? Also yes. God is at work in our lives in many and various ways, and in all of these ways, Jesus takes dubs.

Unfortunately, one of the sticking points of the phrase is understanding what exactly a "dub" is. But with the advent of college football season upon us, this allows me a better opportunity to explain. A football team's record—or the record of any other sport for that matter—gets broken down into wins and losses. In shorthand, one would see it listed as W (for win) and L (for loss). When someone tries to speak those two letters, it's far easier to say the letter L as opposed to W. Somewhere along the line, people started saying "dub" as opposed to saying the whole name of the letter. Perhaps it's a little convoluted, but that's our etymology lesson for the day. A dub is a shorthanded or slang way of saying a win.

When it comes to looking at the phrase "Jesus takes dubs," in essence we're saying that Jesus wins. Maybe it's easier to say "Jesus wins" instead of "Jesus takes dubs," but I have way more fun saying the latter. In saying that Jesus takes dubs, we're declaring something very true about Jesus. We're declaring that Jesus has defeated death and sin, that He has ascended in glory, and that He is coming again soon.

As we live our lives of faith, we see God's hand at work in so many ways. Sometimes God reveals His hand in something truly miraculous; a terminal diagnosis results in an unexpected healing, a deep cry of the heart is answered. Sometimes God shows us His hand in smaller ways where we reflect back on how God was at work.

Within the life of the church, it makes me so joyful to see all of the various ways that God is at work and how Jesus is taking dubs. Jesus takes a dub whenever God's people gather together for worship to hear the story of salvation over again. Jesus takes dubs when we partake in the Lord's Supper. Jesus takes dubs when someone is baptized into His family. Jesus takes dubs in answered prayers. Jesus takes dubs in the lives of our students here as they gather for chapel and learn in their classes.

Jesus continues to also take dubs as His church goes into the community as the hands and feet of Jesus. As we continue developing Engage, I'm so excited to see where Jesus is leading us to serve in His name. In my own prayers, I ask that God show us where He is leading us to serve, and I invite you in the same. It's been really exciting talking with some of the community groups about ways for us to Engage, and I look forward to more of these conversations. The work we do as God's people is never in vain, because we serve a God who gave His life for us and who gives us new life each and every day. He's won, He takes the victory.

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with **McDonnell Elementary School** (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children’s books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. **We have a need for children’s books, activity books, and basic school supplies.** You can support this project by contributing gently used children’s books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! **3-4 servers** are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

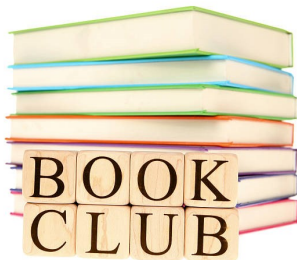

Saints Alive is an adult organization within Grace Lutheran Ministries. The group is open to Grace Lutheran members and their friends. The organization hosts two activities each month on the first and third Wednesdays. September brings new activities for the group. Please consider joining us for one or both of the September outings. Always sign up on the sheets on the narthex easel. There is a little change for the sign-up sheets going forward. There will be two sheets, one will be for those riding the bus and the other for those who are planning to drive themselves. This just makes it easier for us to keep track of when the bus is full.



On **Wednesday, September 4th** the group will tour the **Agricultural Research Station** near Hazel Green. The Research Station is a 972 acre working research farm dedicated to providing the facilities and outdoor laboratories needed to conduct agricultural and environmental research, and is operated by Alabama A&M University. The Station also provides hands-on educational opportunities for students of all ages and the public through its ongoing outreach events. We will receive a briefing by a senior researcher and then ride our bus on a tour of their fields.

Because we will need to be on the Grace bus for the tour of the center, we will all need to ride on the bus during the tour. If you live north of Huntsville and want to meet us at the center, you will need to get on the bus there, so please just indicate that on your sign-up. If necessary, we will use both of the Grace buses.

The bus will depart Grace at **9:30 AM**. Lunch will follow at **Posey's** restaurant near the Research Station. We will have a choice of a buffet line or ordering from their menu. We expect to be back at Grace about **1:30 PM**. Steve Rice is the coordinator of this trip.

On **Wednesday, September 18th** the Saints Alive will tour Black Patch Distilling Company in Madison. This trip will actually begin with lunch at **11:00 AM** at **El Molcajete Restaurant** in Madison. The bus will leave Grace at **10:30 AM**. After lunch we will tour the distillery, where we will be able to taste some of their liquors. Tastings cost \$7.50 each where you get a communion glass-size taste of each of their 7 liquors. There is plenty of seating at Black Patch. Elise Fulda is the coordinator for this trip.

Rip Currents

With each death or rescue from a rip current, I think of the warning signs that were missed, the misleading calmness of the water, and the panic and fear of being pulled further and further out to sea. A rip current is a strong, narrow, and fast-moving channel of water that flows away from the shoreline and out to sea. They can be found at almost any beach with breaking waves. Rip currents can be very narrow or hundreds of yards wide, and can travel up to 8 feet per second, which is faster than an Olympic swimmer.

How often do we get caught in the rip currents of life? As sinners, we ignore the guides and warnings provided in the Bible and think we know better than God. Satan can tempt us into what appears to be the calm water, away from God's calm, safe presence. The deception of Satan tempts us further and further away from God. The current of peer pressure and worldly beliefs can be strong. Fear and panic set in as we are pulled further away from God. We may be tired (like swimming against the current), fighting the pressures of life and losing hope.

However, God is our "Savior," our rescuer. Just as a swimmer calls out for help from the lifeguard, so can we call out to Jesus to rescue us. He hears our prayers. He will provide a way back to him. In Psalm 18: 16-19 we are reminded, *"He reached down from on high and took hold of me; he drew me out of deep waters. He rescued me from my powerful enemy, from my foes who were too strong for me...He brought me out into a spacious place. He rescued me because He delighted in me."* Jesus sacrificed his life to save us! He delights in us! God gives us direction through His word and promises peace. Philippians 4:7 says, *"And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."*

If you are struggling against the rip currents of life, Stephen Ministers are available to help. A Stephen Minister will reflect and listen as you seek God's grace and strength in your life.
