A Mission Visit and Mission Report

A Little Background

All things considered, it Child Beyond International is a relatively new mission. The seeds were sown in 2013 with a vision, prayer, and a heart to do something significant for the Kingdom of God. After much planning, research, and additional prayer, in 2016 Child Beyond International (CBI) launched a children's home in Guatemala that was quickly filled with boys and girls rescued from abuse, neglect, and trauma. Today their children's home is among the most respected in Guatemala. They are currently providing 24-hour care to 20 children who need to heal from various kinds of trauma. Through the ministry of CBI, physical and emotional wounds are healed, children are loved, and Christ is shared. In addition to their children's home, CBI hosts and facilitates short-term mission trips where servants of Christ build homes, install water filtration systems, and host Vacation Bible Schools. It is a great ministry that is doing powerful work for the Kingdom of God.

An Exciting Opportunity

Our congregation has been sending financial support to CBI since 2018, and we have seen our partnership in the Gospel grow through those years. As the relationship has strengthened, Pastor Andrew and I were invited to come to CBI for a visit. We will be traveling to Guatemala from October 7-11 to participate in CBI's Leaders Vision Tour. As part of this tour we will visit CBI's children's home, visit a family who has been gifted a home from CBI's home building ministry, and visit destitute areas where the need for rescue ministry is great. We will also build a cook stove and install a water purifier for a Guatemalan family, meet with local Guatemalan church leaders on critical needs for their ministries, and visit the recently acquired property where CBI plans to expand their rescue ministry for children. It is a full itinerary, and we are excited to continue to build our relationship with CBI.

One of the primary purposes for this trip is for Pastor Andrew and me to see if there are additional ways that Grace Lutheran can support God’s work in Guatemala through CBI. As this relationship has strengthened, we have been considering leading a short-term mission trip to CBI as a way to faithfully serve Jesus, serve others, and spread the Gospel. Disciples of Jesus Worship God, Grow in Faith, and Engage in service, and this could be a great way for us to Engage as a congregation. Our school is our biggest mission outreach as a congregation. Through our school ministry we serve children, we provide an education, and we teach children and young people the eternal truths about Christ. Partnering with an international ministry that rescues and serves children fits perfectly with our identity. We hope to see this partnership continue to grow and mature and look forward to telling you all about it.

Engaging with Engage

At Grace, we seek to build disciples that Worship God, Grow in Faith, and Engage in Service.

Worshipping God is seen most clearly on Sunday mornings through our corporate worship together.

Growing in Faith happens throughout the week. Certainly some of it happens on Sundays, but it isn't limited to just Sunday mornings. Growing in Faith happens through study of God's Word with a community of believers. So while Growing in Faith is something that ultimately happens on a personal level as we each consider what God is doing, an important aspect of Growing in Faith is the community focus to it. We not only Worship God together, but we Grow in Faith together as well.

This leads us into Engaging in Service. Worshiping God has an upward focus to it. Growing in Faith has an inward focus to it. Engaging in Service has an outward focus to it. Engage is always Other-focused. Engage is Go-focused. Through Engage, we serve the people God has placed in our lives. Engage isn't simply gathering offerings for organizations, or collecting supplies to benefit the Other. Engage happens with the hands.

It's funny that at this stage of life, in one of my vocations I am an associate pastor and the director of Engage, but in another vocation, I am engaged to my fiancée, Hannah. I'm a very engaged guy these days! When a couple becomes engaged, a ring is set on the hand. The hands are used. There's an action to becoming engaged. So too it is with Engaging in Service. While it is certainly good to collect offerings and supplies to benefit the Other, the clearest way for us to show the Other who Jesus is happens through action with our hands. Engage looks outward to serve the community.

It is unfortunate that so commonly in churches, Worship becomes something we relegate to only observing on Sunday, Engage takes the action of Sunday and translates it into Monday and Tuesday and the rest of the week. It is a living faith. Jesus doesn't call us only to a life of following him on Sunday, but to also Engage on Monday. Take this faith that God has given you, and watch the Holy Spirit use the gifts unique to you as you serve in Jesus' name.

On Sunday, Pastor Russ challenged us to do one act of kindness this week without recognizing it or letting other people know. I also challenge you to the same. Do an act of kindness for someone without recognizing it or letting others know.

As we continue to develop Engage, I ask that you prayerfully consider how God is working through your hands to serve the Other. I also ask that you pray for God's continued work here in Huntsville as we Engage in Service for the sake of the gospel.

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with **McDonnell Elementary School** (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children’s books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. **We have a need for children’s books, activity books, and basic school supplies.** You can support this project by contributing gently used children’s books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! **3-4 servers** are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

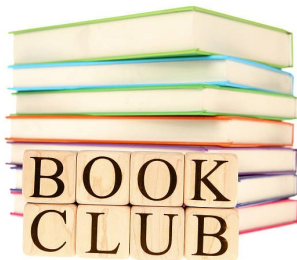

Saints Alive is an adult organization within Grace Lutheran Ministries. The group is open to Grace Lutheran members and their friends. The organization hosts two activities each month on the first and third Wednesdays. September brings new activities for the group. Please consider joining us for one or both of the September outings. Always sign up on the sheets on the narthex easel. There is a little change for the sign-up sheets going forward. There will be two sheets, one will be for those riding the bus and the other for those who are planning to drive themselves. This just makes it easier for us to keep track of when the bus is full.

October continues to be a busy time for the Saints Alive folks. We have two activities planned, on October 2nd and October 16th.

On **October 2nd** the Saints Alive members will go to **Wills Creek Vineyards & Winery** in Attalla. We will hear about wine processing, take a tour, and enjoy a wine tasting. Following the activities, we will eat lunch at the winery, enjoying a hearty baked potato bar with assorted protein, dairy, and vegetable toppings in addition to fresh fruit salads. The potato bar cost is \$15 plus tax and tips.

Following lunch we will go to **Noccalula Falls** and the **Noccalula Princess Statue** near Gadsden. We will stroll along the paved paths and the foot bridge where we will see the statue and the falls. As we stroll on we will come to the **Frios Gourmet Popsicle** stand where we can enjoy dessert.

The bus will leave church at **8:45 AM** and will arrive back at church around 3:30 PM. Kathryn Kervin is the coordinator for the trip.



On **October 16th** the Saints Alive will visit **Constitution Hall Park** (formerly Village). The Park has opened again for guided tours of the main attractions, and we will have our own tour at **10:00 AM**. We will be whisked back to 1819 when Alabama became the 22nd state and our ancestors made the dream of statehood a reality. The only building large enough to accommodate the delegation was a vacant cabinet shop in the center of town. John Boardman's print shop, Clement Comer Clay's law office, the Federal Land Surveyor's office, a post office, and Sheriff Stephen Neal's residence surrounded that cabinet shop. A blacksmith shop also occupies the grounds, although it was located several blocks away in 1819. We will tour all of these buildings and see some demonstrations. Cost is \$10.00 per person. Following the tour, we will enjoy lunch at a local restaurant. The bus will leave Grace at **9:40 AM**. Bob Wank is the contact person for the trip.



November is right around the corner! On **November 6th**, the Saints will visit **Bel Mont Mansion** in Tuscumbia. Bel Mont is one of Alabama's crowning architectural achievements, one of a few Palladian-style houses in the Deep South. We'll see clues suggesting the influence of Thomas Jefferson. Admission is \$6.00 for seniors & military. We will then visit the **Key Underwood Coon Dog Memorial Graveyard**, the only cemetery of its kind in the world. We will go to a local restaurant, yet to be determined, for lunch. Sabina Wank is the contact person for this trip.

Facing the holidays after bereavement

When you're grieving the death of a family member or friend, you may dread the holiday season. Thoughts of social gatherings, family traditions, and obligations leave you anxious and overwhelmed. Your sadness can seem unbearable. You may wish you could skip these next two months and go straight to the routine of next year, but you can't. What can you do to lessen your stress and loneliness?

Holidays can trigger tough emotions. Learning what emotions are normal and to be expected when facing the holidays without your loved one can help you not feel helpless if these emotions are triggered. People who have already experienced a past loss and have been through a holiday season can provide an idea of typical emotions and triggers and provide much-needed comfort and support.

Creating a holiday plan will help provide a little control when you feel out of control. Decide ahead of time what invitations you will accept, what decorating you will do, and which traditions to maintain. Some traditions will be too difficult without your loved one, but there may be new traditions you can start.

Communicating your specific concerns and needs with family and friends can be helpful. People in grief are often tempted to put on a mask and pretend things are fine, especially over the holidays.

So where can you find out what emotions to expect over the holidays, how to create a healthy plan, and how to communicate with family and friends in these coming weeks? Right here at Grace Lutheran Church!

On Sunday, October 20th from 3:00 PM – 5:00 PM we will be offering a GriefShare Surviving the Holidays seminar. This seminar will provide practical, actionable strategies for making it through the holiday season. At this two-hour seminar, you'll view a video featuring advice from people in grief who've faced the holidays after their loss. You'll hear insights from respected Christian counselors, pastors, and psychologists. You'll receive a Holiday Survival Guide with practical strategies, encouraging words, helpful exercises, Q & As, and journaling ideas for daily survival through the holiday season. You'll meet with other grieving people who have an understanding of what you're going through. They won't judge you or force you to share, but will accept you where you are and will offer comfort and support.
