Ministry in Motion

The apostle Paul penned a powerful doxology in Romans 11:33-36 when he wrote:

"Oh, the depth of the riches of wisdom and knowledge of God!
How unsearchable his judgments,
and his paths beyond tracing out!

"Who has known the mind of the Lord?
Or has been his counselor?"

"Who has ever given to God,
that God should repay them?"

"For from him and through him and for him are all things.
To him be the glory forever! Amen."

This doxology is a powerful reminder that God is in control of all things, and when life, elections, careers, family struggles, homework, parental fears, and big projects pile up and become a source of alarm and anxiety, remember that "...from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen." With that doxological foundation, here are some important ministry updates.

Election Day 2024

Election Day is soon approaching. Next week on Tuesday, November 5th, people throughout our nation will go to the polls and cast their ballots in a presidential election and many other elections that are pivotal for the governing of our nation. In fact, many have already participated in early voting. Psalm 146:3 reminds us, "Do not put your trust in princes, in human beings, who cannot save." But Romans 13:1 tells us, "Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God." The governing authority that exists over the United States has been instituted by God, and that governing authority gives the people a say in determining their leaders. In this way, for Christians, voting is not merely a right, it is a holy vocation. With Election Day drawing near, I wanted to share the following short article written by Seminary Professor Dr. Joel Biermann on Religion and Politics. I believe it provides a helpful perspective as we go to the voting booth. Beyond the Booth

The Depth of the Riches

Paul wrote, "Oh the depth of the riches of wisdom and knowledge of God!" Later this month, we will celebrate Thanksgiving. It is a time to reflect on the magnitude of God's blessings to us, and two of those great blessings Paul cites in his Romans 11 doxology – the wisdom of God and knowledge of God. These two blessings, wisdom of God and knowledge of God, are not blessings that we earned or discovered on our own. These two blessings are gifts given to us by a God who loves and provides for us. Sometimes we are tempted to think of riches in terms of material wealth or worldly possessions, but God has shown his generosity to us by making us rich in His wisdom and rich in knowledge of Him. Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God, rose from supper. He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him... When he had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, "Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you.

-John 13:1-3, 12-15

These last few weeks during Sunday School, I've had the opportunity to teach the confirmation class. We've been talking about discipleship, and a big focus of the class has been on being a balanced disciple of Jesus. In last month's Grace Notes, I touched on this idea and how we develop disciples of Jesus through the lenses of Worship, Grow, and Engage.

Throughout the gospels, each writer gives us an amazing picture of what a life of discipleship looks like. Being a disciple of Jesus is to imitate him and follow him. As people who have been baptized and redeemed by Jesus' death on the cross, we live this new resurrected life! What an amazing gift! Jesus shows us how to live by being a servant, using his hands to care for the Other. How better than to see how our Lord demonstrates discipleship than through the events of Maundy Thursday? "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you should do just as I have done to you" (John 13: 14-15). In being a disciple of Jesus, we walk in the places he is leading us in; we follow his example, and we use our hands to serve the Other.

So where is Jesus leading us to be his hands and feet to serve the Other? Recently, the events of hurricanes Helene and Milton left a trail of disaster throughout the southeast. I have been asked if Grace is sending a team to assist in relief efforts. I am currently talking with the Southern District about coordinating a LERT (Lutheran Emergency Response Team) training here at Grace in January. Following the training, we will then deploy a team to go and Engage where the Lord is leading us. For those of you ages 14 and up, I invite you to prayerfully consider if God is calling you to Engage in service in this way.

Where else is Jesus calling this congregation to serve? The Over the Mountain Guntersville community has partnered with First Stop here in Huntsville and recently served lunch to their clients. It was a wonderful opportunity to Engage with those in Huntsville in need of a hot meal. Our two large trays of pulled pork were enjoyed in less than an hour. Smiles were an easy sight to find and the conversation that was shared helped shine the light of Jesus.

How is Jesus calling you into a deeper life of balanced discipleship? Where is Jesus calling you to follow his example of washing feet, using your hands, and Engaging in Service?



LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

As we enter November, Saints Alive will continue to have activities twice during the month. We invite anyone to join us for the activities. We have a lot of fun, learn new things, and enjoy time in fellowship with other adults from our congregation and their guests.

Preparation

With the holidays fast approaching, it's full steam ahead with planning and preparation. Every year after the holidays, I find myself reflecting on why I didn't start preparing earlier. Some people begin planning in July for gifts to give at Christmas, and the stores order their merchandise in April or May to start displaying before Halloween! We begin to hear the question, "Are you ready for the holidays?"

We recently held an event, Surviving the Holidays, that presented ideas for those grieving the loss of someone close to them during the holidays. Grief encompasses death, but also so many other relationship losses in our lives. The primary focus was planning and preparing when you are grieving and may be feeling sad and lonely. We spoke about traditions, planning your response to questions about your loss, and responding to invitations.

We often have a checklist of all the events and things to do in preparation, but what about our spiritual checklist? The past few years at my house, holidays never seem to go as I planned. However, there is always the constant of Thanksgiving in November and celebrating Christmas, Christ's birth, in December. We can make our plans, but the LORD determines our steps. - Proverbs 16:9

So, what does our spiritual preparation look like? Isn't it all, really, about God's plan? God planned and prepared His people for the miracle of Christ's birth. What would Jesus want for the celebration of His birthday? Thanksgiving Baskets





Nondeductible Giving

Our giving management system will now allow us to track nondeductible giving. Therefore, qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) and donor-advised fund (DAF) grants will now appear in your giving history and on year-end giving statements. These types of gifts will be separated out and clearly marked as nondeductible on your giving statement. We will continue to send a letter of acknowledgment for these gifts as well after year-end. A reminder regarding these types of gifts:

- QCDs A QCD is not a tax-deductible charitable gift. However, a QCD can count towards the annual IRA required minimum distribution and may not be considered taxable income.
- DAF Grants You should receive your official, tax-deductible receipt for these gifts through the donor-advised fund.

We recommend consulting your tax or legal advisor to properly report your charitable gifts.

Joint Donors

Many donors prefer to have a single, combined statement with another donor in their household. If your giving history and year-end giving statement currently show your individual giving only and you would like to be joined with another member of your household, please notify the Business Office at so we can make that change. Once joined with another individual, you'll share a single donation history and receive a combined giving statement after year-end.
