Lord, Lead Us, We Pray

Psalm 25:4-5 are great verses for our congregation in our present context, and they are great verses for any context. It is a psalm of David, and there in Psalm 25 David declares, "Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long." There are many situations we find ourselves in and many experiences that we have on this side of glory when we just don't quite know...

What's the right thing to do?
or
What's the right thing think?
or
What is the right thing to say?

Circumstantial complexities, fear of failure, competing opportunities, conflicting goals, personal insecurities, relational turbulence, and countless other experiences and emotions can leave us suffering a kind of paralysis - a paralysis of action, a paralysis of mental clarity, or a paralysis of words. Such paralysis can lead to spiritual frustration and loneliness. King David led a turbulent life. His success and faithfulness to the LORD led to the murderous envy of King Saul, whom David was just trying to serve. David struggled with significant conflicts in his own family; he committed adultery and had Uriah killed to cover it up. His life was more than turbulent, it was pure chaos. He certainly had moments of not knowing what to do, or what to think, or what to say. And yet at the same time his life occasionally looked like a dumpster fire, he also experienced moments of tremendous joy and opportunity. God delivered Goliath into his hands, and gave him the honor of returning the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem. In moments of such joy and opportunity, you wonder if David sometimes didn't know what to do, or think, or say. Whether his life was mimicking a dumpster fire or a Super Bowl, David knew what to pray, "Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long."

Visiting Our Mission Partner Child Beyond

Pastor Andrew and I had an opportunity to visit our mission partner, Child Beyond International (CBI) in early February. We were inspired and grateful for the faithful work of CBI in Guatemala, and we look forward to deepening our mission partnership with them in the months and years ahead. CBI is in need of additional funding to continue the great work they are doing, and we hope to schedule a short-term mission trip out of Grace Lutheran as early as the Spring of 2026. "Make us to know your ways, O LORD..."

Master Plan Update

In January our Master Plan Committee shared the work that they have been doing with Fuqua and Partners Architects in developing a Master Plan for our campus. The meetings were well-attended and the accompanying survey provided great feedback to our Master Plan Committee. The committee has met and gone over that feedback and has reached out to Fuqua and Partners to schedule an additional meeting to refine the plan before it will be brought forward to the congregation to consider for approval. "... Teach us your paths..."

WORSHIP - Lent

On Wednesday of this week, we enter into the season of Lent. During our midweek services this year, together we will track through a sermon series titled "Prayers of the Passion." Each week we will unpack a prayer that came from the lips of Jesus during the time of His Passion. Blessings on your repentance and spiritual growth during the season of Lent. "Lead us in your truth and teach us, for you are the God of our salvation."

Principal Call Process

We received news from Grace Stearns regarding the Call to serve as Principal at Grace Lutheran, and she has returned that Call. Upside-Down Jesus

"He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent empty away."

–Luke 1:53

"For who is the greater, one who reclines at table or one who serves?

Is it not the one who reclines at table?

But I am among you as the one who serves."

-Luke 22:24

This year, our lectionary readings have us walking through the gospel of Luke as we gather for worship on Sundays. We could have a whole different conversation about the lectionary, but that's not important for today. What is important—or at the very least, helpful—is that over the course of this church year we read Luke's account of the gospel, and we get to see the way Luke presents Jesus to the world. Right off from the beginning of his account, Luke paints this picture of what I'll call an upside-down Jesus. The reality of the Christ in the world shakes the very foundations of life upside-down. The advent of the reign of God in the world makes high places become low, and low places are lifted up. Those who are highly regarded are humbled, and the lowly are exalted. Jesus shakes everything up as he reorients the world into what the reign of God and the kingdom of God look like. Nothing stays the same after Jesus gets his hands on it.

The reign and kingdom of God challenges what many of us might think a reign or a kingdom or greatness might look like. As I reflect on my short time in Guatemala, I'm reminded that God's kingdom looks different than what my eyes think it might. I come back to an essential question when reading any gospel account: Who does Jesus come to save? The Sunday School answer rightly says, "Jesus comes to save everyone," and that's exactly right. Jesus is for everyone. But how far does "everyone" include? "Everyone" is an easy answer to give when "everyone" looks, speaks, acts, dresses, and lives like we might. But that's a limited view of "everyone." If we really dug into it, there's only one person who fits those exact qualifications, and that's a far cry from "Jesus is for everyone."

Jesus challenges our very understanding of ourselves, how we see others, and how vast his love is for his whole creation. How does Jesus see us? He sees that regardless of status, success, or failures in life, every single person has the exact same need. We all are broken people, we all are needy people, we all are hungry for the same thing. Jesus sees every person as one desperately in need of a savior. He sees every person as one starved for the love and forgiveness that only Jesus can provide. Jesus sees you, and the widow, and the orphan, and the centurion all as someone worth dying for. And it blows my mind every time I seriously ponder how deep Jesus loves everyone. Jesus' upside-down love is far beyond the selfish love we give to ourselves and perhaps to those who fit in our bubble. Jesus' upside-down love is so much greater and deeper than any of us could ever hope to have.

This month we begin our Lenten journey to the cross, and I have a few questions for you to reflect on. As Jesus is shaping you, where is Jesus flipping things upside-down? Where is Jesus making low the high places in your life? Where is he raising to new life the low places? How is Jesus continuing to mess with you? Where is Jesus calling you to serve and to give up your life for the sake of someone else?

Blessings on your Lenten journey as we follow Jesus together.

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

Saints Alive is an adult organization within Grace Lutheran Ministries. The group is open to Grace Lutheran members and their friends. The organization hosts two activities each month on the first and third Wednesdays. Always sign up on the sheets on the narthex easel. There is a little change for the sign-up sheets going forward. There will be two sheets, one will be for those riding the bus and the other for those who are planning to drive themselves. This just makes it easier for us to keep track of when the bus is full.

Busy Schedule Ahead!

Unfortunately, because of the winter weather forecast for Wednesday, February 19th, we had to reschedule the trip to Orbix Glass in Fort Payne. We will be going there on **April 16th** instead.

On **Wednesday, March 5th** we will be going to Decatur to tour the **Princess Theatre**, an old movie theater that opened to silent movies in 1919. The theater was remodeled in art deco style and reopened in 1941. We will tour there and then watch the movie, "The Magic of Belle Isle," starring Morgan Freeman. It has had good reviews from seniors and has no bad language or sexual content. The bus will leave Grace at **9:15 AM** and will stop at the Cracker Barrel to pick up folks from the Madison area. The cost of the tour is \$5 per person with the option to get popcorn and coke for \$12 per person. Lunch will follow at Kimmie's restaurant across the street from the theater. Shirley Vigil is the coordinator for this trip. Sign up on the easel in the narthex.

On **March 19th**, the Saints Alive will travel to **Chattanooga** for two activities. First we will visit the IMAX Theater at the Tennessee Aquarium at **11:00 AM ET** to view the 45 minute documentary entitled *T. REX 3D* featuring leaps in CGI wizardry and revolutions in tyrannosaur paleontology over the past 25 years. Next we will have lunch at the Mellow Mushroom. Following that, at **2:30 PM ET**, we will tour the campus of the University of Tennessee Chattanooga, provided by the admissions department. We will leave Grace at **7:00 AM CT** and return about **5:30 PM CT** just in time for the Lenten supper at church.

In regards to the Lenten dinners, the Saints Alive members will provide the meal at the dinner on **March 26th**. Sign-up sheets will be on the bulletin board in the narthex for those who are willing to help in various ways. The main dish will be baked spaghetti. The ingredients will be provided to those who are willing to bake a dish. Thrivent Action Team funds will be used to buy the ingredients and other food items. Please consider helping with this meal.

On **April 2nd** we will travel to Lacey's Spring to visit **Manna House's Hydroponic Garden**. Come and see where 5–10 acres of lettuce (21,000 heads) can be grown in one room! We will be given planting/harvesting instructions and put on a disposable gown, shoe covering, etc. before we plant or harvest lettuce. Then we will proceed to the Harvest Room and Water Supply Room before entering the gardens. There is the opportunity for us to harvest or plant lettuce seeds for about one hour. Simple instructions will be provided. Please wear comfortable clothing and shoes. More information about times and other details will be coming as the date gets closer.




